THE UPPER-SCHOOL CURRICULUM

The academic program is delivered in a rotating block schedule with two 75-minute and one 30-minute class period per class per week. The school year is divided into two semesters of approximately 18 weeks. Typical class load is 7 classes and one study hall, though students with more rigorous schedules may opt for a second. Wakefield offers a dual English program with dedicated Literature and Composition periods at each grade level. In the 11th- and 12th-grade years, Composition is devoted to the Junior and Senior theses. The Senior Thesis is a yearlong inquiry into a topic of the student's choosing and the culmination of all that the students have learned about writing, research, rhetoric, and organization. Each thesis must make an argument, but it does not have to be a research paper, as students may choose whatever presentation format they desire. Academic Response to COVID-19: In 2021-2022, Wakefield maintained full-time, in-person instruction throughout the entire academic year.
